William P. (Billy) Lacobie, Jr.
General Manager, Strategy and Planning, Chevron Upstream

We are pleased to welcome Billy Lacobie to our February 27 lunch. He is the Chief Advisor to the executive vice president for Upstream, Jay Johnson. Billy will provide us with an overview of major Upstream projects, including the timing of progress of Gorgon for at least the first two trains, as well as the status of Wheatstone and the increasing importance of the Permian Basin.

Billy directs strategy and planning activities for Chevron's upstream segment, a role he assumed in August 2016. Prior to this, he was the general manager of asset development for the Mid-Continent business unit in the Chevron North America Exploration and Production Company in Houston, Texas.

Billy has held various leadership positions in Chevron, including in operations in Chevron Pipe Line Company, greenfield development in Angola, asset management in Indonesia and operations in the Gulf of Mexico.

He joined Chevron in 1994 as a production engineer in Lafayette, Louisiana. He earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Southwestern Louisiana in 1994.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR

Thank you so much for your generous contributions to our chapter's scholarship program! Because of your generosity, we will be offering **FOUR** scholarships for the 2017-2018 school year. As a reminder, our chapter's scholarship program begins when the 2017 dues notice is sent out. As in past years, the scholarships are for one year and awards will be based on academic merit and extra-curricular activities. Scholarship America, a national non-profit educational support organization, will select the recipients and distribute the awards. We suggest that you encourage your children, grandchildren or great-grandchildren to apply for one of the scholarships as their chances of getting one have been about 1 in 4.

Students may apply each year they are eligible, but those who have previously been awarded a scholarship by our organization are not eligible to reapply. The criteria for eligibility are:

- Be a child, grandchild or great grandchild of a dues-paying member of the chapter.
- Be age 25 and under.
- Be enrolled, or plan to be enrolled, in the coming school year in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two or four-year college or university.
- Submit your scholarship application to Scholarship America **NO LATER THAN MAY 2, 2017**. The application may be completed online but it cannot be saved and sent directly to Scholarship America. Remember to print out what you have completed on the application.

The amount of each scholarship is \$2000 this year and the number of scholarships approved by the Board of Directors is four. However, this may change depending on the donations of the members. We appreciate your support of this program and hope you will add some additional money with your dues payment to continue this support. The individuals we support may be future leaders of Chevron and they think highly of our company for this gift.

ATTENTION: ONE EXCHANGE KAISER MEMBERS

Mike Elgie, Chevron Retirees Association President, has information for Chevron retirees who are post-65 and members of Kaiser. "Out here in California, prime Kaiser territory, we have been hearing about a little extra rider available from Kaiser. It is called Senior Advantage Plus. It is only available in areas where Kaiser operates, and not all of them. This can be checked on the website [kp.org/advantageplus]. It is primarily eligible on the West Coast."

Mike adds, "It costs \$20/month and gives a little extra coverage for dental, vision and hearing. It also has a fitness part that covers membership of associated facilities. Chevron and OneExchange have assured us that those who choose to arrange this directly with Kaiser will not affect their selected coverage or HRA."

He explains, "One can enroll via their website or call a Kaiser Member Services. Member Services can be reached on the phone by calling 800-464-4000 and following the telephone tree to Membership Services. You may also have another local number. I understand this is available for a limited period during 1Q17. If you are interested, it would be best to contact Kaiser fairly soon."




DIRECTIONS TO CONTRA COSTA COUNTRY CLUB, PLEASANT HILL, GOING SOUTH

From I-680 South, take Chilpancingo/Concord Avenue exit. Turn left at the traffic light (you will see Target on the right hand side of the street). Continue straight through the traffic light. At the next traffic light, make right on Golf Club Road (you will see a Chevron Gas Station on right hand side of the street). Continue on Golf Club Road (past DVC Community College) until the road forks to the left. Stay to the right on Golf Club Road. Continue on Golf Club Road through a residential area. Drive ahead to the Contra Costa Country Club at #801 on Golf Club Road.

DIRECTIONS TO CONTRA COSTA COUNTRY CLUB, PLEASANT HILL, GOING NORTH

Take Highway 24 to I-680 North. Take Willow Pass Road exit. Turn left off freeway onto Willow Pass Road and continue to the third traffic light. Be in the right hand lane and turn right onto Contra Costa Boulevard. Continue on Contra Costa Boulevard through two traffic lights. At the second traffic light, turn left onto Golf Club Road (Citibank will be on left hand side of the street). Continue on Golf Club Road (past DVC Community College) until the road forks to the left. Stay to the right on Golf Club Road. Continue on Golf Club Road through a residential area. Drive ahead to the Contra Costa Country Club at #801 on Golf Club Road.
